 - The district funding as of December 2016 for the 2016-17 school year was 255.26 Average Daily Membership up from 235.22 for the 2015-16 school year.

Gervais School District has built a robust and modern technology infrastructure that allows us to readily pursue and support emerging strategies in the ever-evolving world of educational technology.

Technology Continued

Our classrooms are all equipped with document cameras and LCD projectors to allow teachers to access rich and engaging educational content. Our technology initiatives for 2018-19 include:

- Completing the project of adding ceiling-mounts for the LCD projectors in all classrooms
- A refresh of all teacher desktops
- A refresh of our server infrastructure
- Adding 5 more classroom sets of Chromebooks at the high school with wall-mounted charging racks
- Continued Google implementation, integration, focus, and professional development

School Nutrition 2016-17

Melinda Fitz-Henry-Food Service Manager

- Gervais received the second year of the Farm to School Grant of \$6,555 to procure Oregon grown or processed food for the cafeteria.
- The food service staff added a food service assistant to our elementary staff. This increased the food service staff to eight.
- An additional walk-in was added to the elementary cafeteria.
- A generator was purchased for the big freezer that holds our commodities from the USDA.

School Nutrition 2016-17 Continued

In the 2016-17 school year the School Nutrition Program:

- Served 137,347 Lunches
- Served 85,478 Breakfasts
- Served 14,873 Afterschool Suppers
- Served a fresh fruit or vegetable snack to the elementary and middle school students
- Served 4858 Summer School Lunches
- Served 1913 Summer School Breakfasts
- Grants
- \$4,000 Fuel Up to Play 60 Grant for Gervais Elementary School: used to purchase activity supplies for the elementary after-school program and a new sound system and television in the elementary cafeteria
- \$5,900 Start-Up and Expansion Grant for Summer Meals Program: used to purchase a new milk cooler, portable hand washing stations, and supplies to support summer events.

School Nutrition 2016-17 Continued

- A second chance breakfast was added to the high school. Students who did not receive a breakfast before school can receive one during the passing time after first period.
- The Food Service Department, along with several community partners, hosted three summer community events.
 - Bicycle Rodeo Health & Safety Fair Back to School Celebration
- Our summer meal program was expanded to include serving in Brooks at the Green Oaks Mobile Ranch.

All after school activities include an afternoon meal and transportation home. The Parent Evening Program also provides a dinner for the families attending.


Gervais Daycare Pre-K Program




Ethnic Breakdown (Oct 1 of each year)




Number of Homeless Students K-12












Primary Disability



Placement of Sp. Ed. Students




Membership History (Oct 1 of each year)





Goals Remain the Same


 Refine and Practice the Professional Learning Community (PLC) cycle.




Reading Knowledge & Skills Gervais Middle School



Gervais Middle School Attendance Rates






Reading Knowledge & Skills Gervais High School






Gervais High School Attendance




Freshmen-On-Track

Sam Brown Academy Focus School

* General Summary

- * SBA staff has developed a restructuring plan based on analyzed information.
- We have a supportive environment and improved guidelines focused on student academic achievement, daily attendance and positive student behavior.
- Student mental health is also being addressed and assessed.

SBA School Improvement Funding

SBA was awarded \$16,077 for school improvement during the 2016/2017 school years. We plan to spend the majority of the awarded amount on online curriculum licenses, software to support interventions, and professional development with classroom management.

The money will be used and spent primarily in ways which will help us to continue to increase student performance.

SBA Positive Accomplishments

- Mid-year staffing changes to accommodate learning style and environment.
- Improved online learning system.
- * Comprehensive school improvement plan for 2016/17.
- Strengthened GED and Post Grad partnerships with Chemeketa Community College.
- * Positive student incentive programs were developed.
- * Strong partnership and support from ODE.
- * Student progress in on-line curriculum has jumped dramatically in the second semester.
- * Restructuring of classroom and other instructional space has led to increased performance.

Accomplishments


- * 61% of students who needed 8 or less credits at the beginning of the year graduated or received a GED.
- * We have strengthened our student intake process.
- * Sam Brown students will be able to take core, elective, and CTE classes from GHS certified teachers.
- * Clear direction for professional development.
- * Significant increase seen with student attendance, behavior and academic performance.
- * Attendance: Our Student Daily Attendance went from 49.5% in September to 79%-85% for each month since.
- * Behavior: The negative behavioral incidents have been reduced from 5-10 a month to maybe only 1-2 a month.
- * Academic Performance: The number of daily assignments completed online has increased from an average of 30-40 a day to 160-168 a day.




Attendance Rates – SBA




SBA Graduation Rate




Drop Out Rates – SBA




Discipline / Incidents (District-Wide)




SAT Critical Reading Test Scores
