## Freshmen

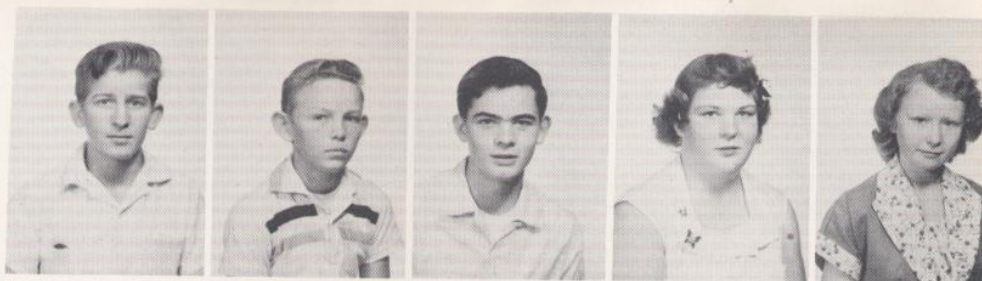
The Freshman Class was honored by a welcome party given by the Sophomores on September 14th. We reciprocated with a party for them several weeks later.

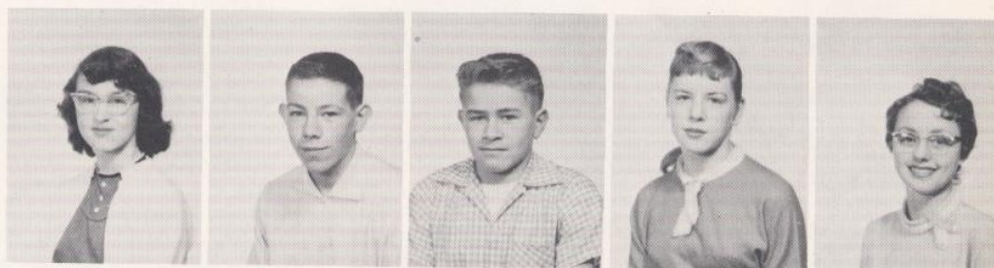
