The past four years has brought many experiences to this class of Seniors.

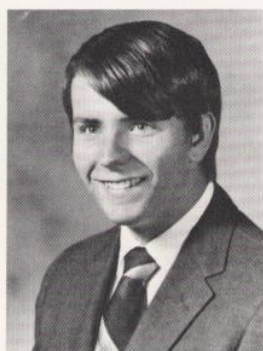
These students have been the last class to be initiated at Gervais, and one of the few classes to lose Homecoming in their Senior year and worked hard together during Spirit Week.
