- What are the potential impacts of these groups?

Who has the opportunities? Who is included and who is not?

- Are existing disparities ignored or worsened?
- Are there unintended consequences?

Whose voices are at the table?

Have we intentionally involved our partners?

What can we do about it?

 How will we mitigate the negative impacts and address the barriers identified above?
