Why the Early Literacy Success Grant Matters

- Securing an Early Literacy Success School District Grant is another funding source for our school district to have the resources necessary to boost and enhance our ability to deliver high-quality literacy instruction and interventions.
 - We can opt to customize how the funds are spent in many ways, and we plan to use the funds to help pay for our Reading TOSA position.

Early Literacy Success School District Grants

What: Non-competitive, application-based, annual grant-in-aid

Who: School districts and eligible public charter schools that are elementary schools

Why: To support comprehensive early literacy plans that are research-based

When: Application deadline January 8, 2024

How Much: \$90 million for the 2023-25 biennium funded through the Statewide Education Initiatives Account

Early Literacy Plan:

Our application for the Early Literacy Success School District Grant covers the initial 2023-2025 biennium and was submitted on December 12, 2023.



Required Inventory—who did what?

Allocation:

2023-24--\$70,284

2024-25--\$73,153

The full amount for both year's will go towards the salary and benefit cost of our reading TOSA.

Early Literacy Program Review Strengths:

- Already in Year 2 of focused work
- Adoption of curriculum and ongoing PD
- Pre-K curriculum aligned to GES
- Data analysis every 6-7 weeks
- Tiered support systems/curriculum/assessments
- Strong relationships with students/staff
- Literacy Nights/focus already in place
